Founded in 1982 in Gräfelfing near Munich (Germany) Naturland is registered as a non profit organisation. In Germany 1.784 Naturland farmers are cultivating approx 137.800 hectares. In 1989 Naturland has started its international commitment. World wide 38.000 farmers mostly organised in smallholder-cooperatives cultivate more than 117.000 hectares following Naturland standards.

- Training of members in cultivation and certification issues
- Support to investigation and development of organic agriculture
- Cooperation with developing countries considering social aspects
- Consumer information about organic agriculture

IFOAM Accreditation

The Naturland logo stands for reliable and recognized certification. Naturland was the first German organic certifier to attain IFOAM (International Federation of Organic Agriculture Movements) accreditation in 1997 and to be accredited according to European Norm DIN EN 45011/ISO 65 in 1998.



The cultivation guidelines intend to facilitate the conversion to organic agriculture and Naturland wishes the farmers every success in applying them.
